AMDAF is a registered charity in Ireland established in 2019. We are als registered with the Charities Regulator.

AMDAF operates as a company limited by guarantee without capital share. The organisation is governed by a Board of Trustees and Administrative Executives from diverse backgrounds and professions. The board meets six times a year, likewise the Executives.

Support

The work of AMDAF is also supported by the community, made up of both migrants and indigenous people from different backgrounds and expertise.

Aim and Mission

AMDAF envisions a future where women of African descent and their families enjoy equal opportunity and are not judged based on race or gender. Our vision is that every family is recognised without discrimination, respected, and treated justly.

Our mission is to contribute to the protection and promotion of civil, political, economic, social and cultural rights of women of African descent and their families in Ireland. We also aim to serve as advocate of their rights, promoter of their capacities and driving force of social change through community development projects, public educational campaigns, and awareness-raising programmes.

Social Enterprise

AMDAF launched a social enterprise – GOCOM Radio in 2021, an online commun that bridges under-representation gap of new and marginalised communities in mainstream media; aimed at making every voice heard and creating a more inclusive community.





2023 Projects/Activities

Inaugurate Board of management for GOCOM Radio.



• **Talking Integration project**, funded by the Department of Children, Equality, Disability, Integration and Youth, under the International Protection Applicants Fund 2022.

This is a 5-part project from December 2022 to August 2023 The project features:

1. Integration Research/Needs Analysis – new community always finds it challenging to integrate into the economic, cultural, and political sphere of society. This research aims at understanding immigrants' wellbeing, their experiences, opinions, requirements and expectations; as well as needs of host the community.

An integration workshop will be organised to present the research outcome.

Targets: public representatives, charity organisations, community groups, businesses, professionals, educators, and others, who are actively and collectively addressing the needs of the IPAs and facilitating the integration and inclusion of immigrants.

2. AMDAF Women Roundtable - AMDAF Women Roundtable is a safe network style event designed for migrant women and their friends looking to talk in a non-judgemental unbiased space, meet other women they would normally not relate with, break barriers, blaze trails, or otherwise be agents of change in their communities.

The event would bring migrant women, Irish women, traveller women, women living with disability, and women seeking international protection together to hold critical, yet empowering conversations on issues affecting them.

AWR 2023 is themed: *"Flourishing Seed"*, highlighting women's sense of freedom and empowerment in the wake of traumatic experiences they face in life. The theme will target 4 issues through which women experience labels, limitations, and stereotypes; and boxes they may try to squeeze women into. Inspired by Meghan Sparkles' *Archetypes* podcast, 2022.

AWR Panels:



Women's Reproductive Health

Domestic Violence, Racism/Sexism: Man-ifesting a Cultural Shift

Women's Mental Health. Focus on health and wellbeing to encourage women take charge of their health.

There will also be clinics on Voters Registration.

Aim: The Theme is aimed at encouraging women to, like a seed, keep flourishing, and refuse to be limited or boxed.

There will be Intercultural EPIC Awards to honour community champions.

Intercultural Business Expo – AMDAF Intercultural Business Expo is a platform to learn more about local businesses, traditions, foods, music and for SMEs to network and showcase their products and services to their immediate local community.



Theme: Power your Dream

Focus: Every entrepreneurial journey starts with a dream, and the Expo supports entrepreneurs to rediscover and reconnect with the joy, passion and more of who they were when starting their business.

The Expo answers questions such as: Are you living the life you imagined? Or is it time to reimagine? Are you feeling focused and driven? Or do you need the space to breathe and refocus? Are you ready to take that next step and grow? Or do you need your community to surround and lift you up?

The Expo offers entrepreneurial resources, networks, influential panel discussions, and exhibitions.

3. Health and Wellbeing Workshops – There will be monthly workshops asylur and refugee women on various issues, especially wellbeing and mental health.



4. Employment and Capacity Building Trainings – Support services and trainings for IPAs to earn new skills and improve employability. This includes creating a CV, help with access to training opportunities, assist with job search, and guide to volunteering to gain job experience in relevant field.

5. Evolving Light - Boys to Men Mentoring for age 19-25 - Every month, our mentors meet their mentees for 2 hours to listen, encourage, and empower them. The mentors will also be in schools, and community centres to motivate young boys and girls.

- Dance Against Cancer 2023 AMDAF believes NO woman should travel the journey of cancer alone. Dance Against Cancer (DAC)
 event was created by AMDAF in 2020 to bring the community together to fig through dance, with an annual public lecture to create awareness around Breast Cancer and other forms of Cancer.
 - The event is structured as a one-month long fundraiser for a chosen Cancer Research organisation, and an event day featuring talk, star guest interview with cancer survivor, dance and performance featuring singers and dancers.
 - **Partnership and collaborations:** We continue strengthening our partnerships and networks in Galway and across Ireland.
